April 11: Join Father Joe's Villages' Easter Feast for a Time of Reflection and Connection

WHAT:

<u>Father Joe's Villages</u> is observing the Easter holiday and celebrating spring and renewal alongside families and individuals experiencing homelessness. This year, the traditional Easter meal, prepared by Executive Chef Amiel Brosoto and his team, will include 1,250 lbs of honey ham, 150 lbs of whipped sweet potato casserole, 90 lbs of lemon green beans with walnuts, 50 breads for sausage stuffing and 75 lbs of cranberry walnut spice cake.

Deacon Jim Vargas, CEO of Father Joe's Villages, will lead a prayer at the beginning of the meal.

WHY:

The Easter meal reminds us of the importance of human connection in the role of organizations like Father Joe's Villages in serving the needs of the community.

Along with a chance to celebrate being together, Easter is a chance for those who are transitioning out of homelessness to recognize how far they've come on their journey to achieving independence.
